

GARDEN PLOT PROGRAM
RULES AND REGULATIONS EXAMPLE

1. All plots must be actively used by June 1. Plots will be inspected by the first week of June and warning letters sent to those not in use. Plots not in use by the third week of June may be declared abandoned and offered to the next available person on the waiting list.
2. Plots will be inspected at least two other times during the year. Plots that are excessively weedy or appear abandoned will receive warning letters. If no action is taken within 2 weeks, the plot may be declared abandoned and offered to the next available person on the waiting list.
3. Gardeners who have abandoned a plot may not lease a new one for at least one year and will lose their deposit.
4. Trash and litter must be cleared from the plots, using provided receptacles.
5. Weeds must be kept under control.
6. Do not use fertilizers, herbicides or pesticides that in any way affects other plots.
7. Pick only your own crops (except by permission).
8. Plot corners are clearly marked with metal stakes. These should not be removed.
9. Individual fencing of plots is allowed. Keep fences and structures under 6' in height. Fencing must not go outside the officially marked boundaries.
10. Do not plant very tall or sprawling plants where they will interfere with your neighbor's garden.
11. STRUCTURES MAY BE LEFT UP OVER THE WINTER IF YOU INTEND TO RENEW YOUR GARDEN LEASE. THE GARDEN SHOULD BE LEFT NEAT FOR THE WINTER. WEEDS AND DEAD PLANTS SHOULD BE PUT IN AREAS DESIGNATED FOR COMPOSTABLE MATERIALS.
12. Report any theft or suspicious activity immediately.
